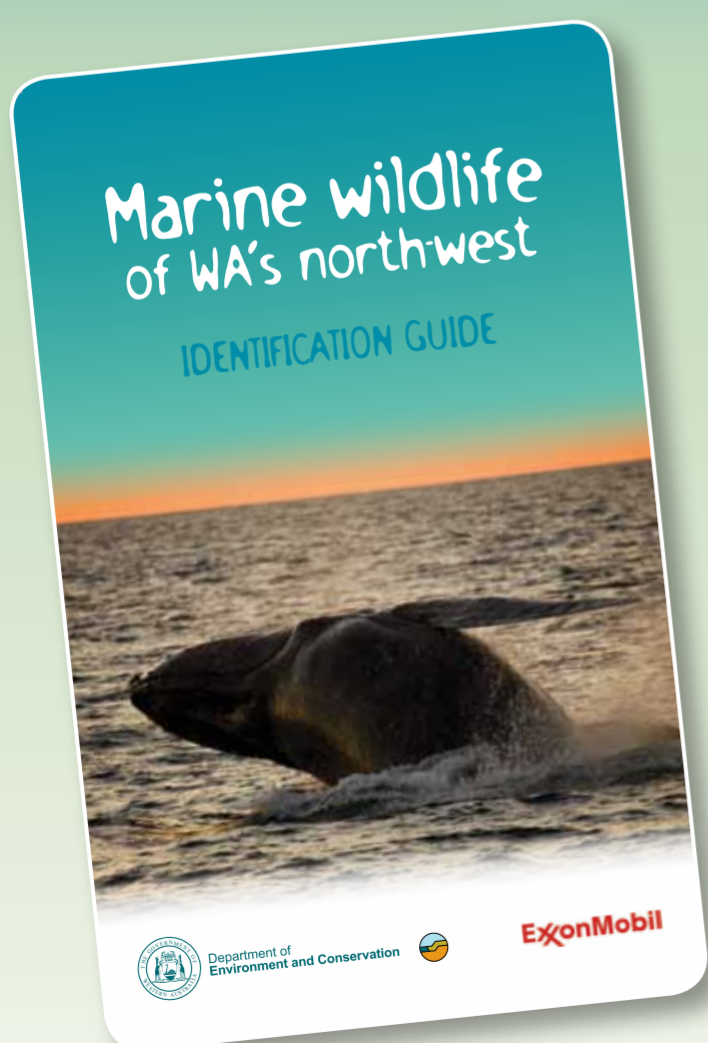
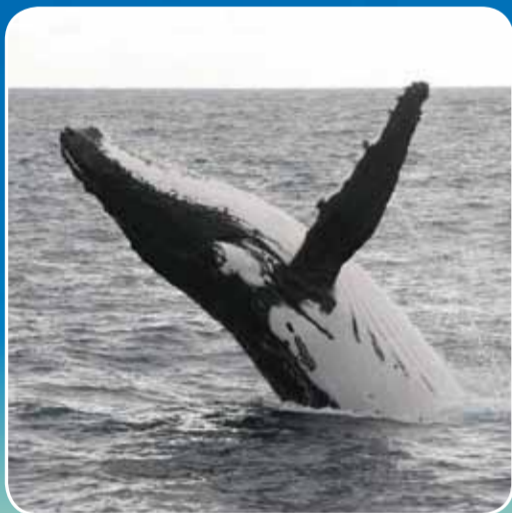


Marine wildlife of WA's north-west



Top tips for conserving marine life

- Support a 'Clean Marine' environment and take your rubbish home, and please pick up any rubbish you find floating at sea or on the coast.
- If you find a stranded, sick or injured dolphin, dugong, turtle, whale or seabird, please call the Department of Environment and Conservation's (DEC) 24 hour Wildcare Helpline on 9474 9055.
- If you find a tagged turtle or other animal, please note the number and contact DEC. If you should find a dead marine mammal or turtle you should also advise DEC.
- Fish for the future! Abide by fish size, bag and possession limits set by the Department of Fisheries.
