Engineering holiday fun for school kids

Mobil has been working with Scienceworks Museum in Spotswood to deliver educational, enjoyable and engineering-focused school holiday activities for children as part of its longstanding partnership with the museum.

Meet Robyn Reimers, Refinery Operator

It's so great to be back at Altona refinery. I first spent 15 years in the maintenance team here from 1988 to 2003. After a lengthy break, I am really happy to be working here again, and taking on new challenges in an operations role

What does your job at the refinery involve?

Keeping abreast of training and changes in the way we isolate, prepare and manage the day-to-day operations definitely keeps our group busy all year round. Although at times the environment we work in can be challenging, it makes for a varied and interesting role. These days the job requires a high level of process knowledge, which further adds to its appeal.

What do you look forward to in your role?

The operations role is one that offers me an unlimited amount of personal growth. There will never be a moment in time where I can afford to stand still. Another reason I am a fan of this role is that it requires an element of teamwork. Working in a zone where team leaders, engineers and other team members really band together is something that Altona does very well.

Work history prior to this role?

My working life started as far back as 1981, working jobs that involved electronics, instrumentation, electrical maintenance, as well as a few stints in operations at another refinery. Having worked in fertilizer factories, roof spaces in government buildings and construction projects, there are lots of life experiences I can draw on. After my 15 years at the Altona Refinery, I spent seven years running my own corporate health club. This gave me a valuable lesson in dealing with people.

What did you study?

Being a maths/science student in high school, I went on to do my certificate in technology in electronics. Some study in anatomy and physiology – health and wellbeing is a key interest area of mine. Some studies in bookkeeping/accounting.

Hobbies?

Keen runner with a couple of added weekly sessions at the local gym.

Celebrating balance on Women's Day

The theme for this year's International Women's Day was #BalanceforBetter – a balanced world is a better world.

This was celebrated at the refinery with a morning tea and cupcakes.

ExxonMobil has learned over many years that a balanced business is also a better business.

"The petroleum industry is a highly competitive business, and the market landscape continues to evolve," said Altona Refinery Technical Manager Leona Chua.

"A constant flow of new, fresh ideas and viewpoints, and challenging paradigms is needed to be greater at what we do than anyone else to win.

"The diversity of thought, learning from each other, and an environment where everyone feels valued and knows they can add value, is essential to compete.

"We know that the best way of achieving this is to cast a wide net – to have a diverse, balanced workforce."

A number of years ago ExxonMobil embarked on a strategy to recruit more women and this has given the company a competitive edge in the quest for the best technical minds.

While women still only make up a small proportion of the refinery's workforce, they contribute a wide range of important positions.

Recently Robyn Reimers took up a position as a Control Panel Operator in the refinery's central control room, making her one of very few women doing this role in ExxonMobil.

"Attracting the best people and retaining them throughout their working lives is a significant challenge," said Jenny Bransfield, Chair of ExxonMobil Australia's Women in Energy Network (WEN), a group supporting the professional advancement and personal growth of all women in the company.

"We work to develop an environment that assists our people to achieve a meaningful long-term, successful career with development opportunities, while providing the flexibility they may need to achieve what they want to do personally."

Altona Refinery Manager Riccardo Cavallo said that maintaining a diverse and inclusive team was critical to the refinery's success.

"It is so important to me that everyone feels that they will be listened to, no matter who they are or what their background is. And that their ideas will be valued.

"This is how we maintain a safe, efficient, high-performing refinery."

The free community concert coincided with another local milestone – 70 years of Altona Refinery operations.




